## BCYC Summer Junior Program

### Parent Orientation Night

#### **Important Notes**

- Lunch is included in class tuition and will be provided 5 days per week.
- Class tuition must be paid in full prior to the start of the program on June 25<sup>th</sup>.
- Registration may be cancelled prior to the start of the program and refunds will be administered less a \$50 service charge. After the program begins all class fees are non-refundable.
- Families with multiple children enrolled in the program will be credited \$50 per child after registration is submitted.
- As classes fill, Members and Junior Members of the club will have priority at registration.
- Non-members will be assessed an additional \$150 fee at registration.
- Early Registration Pricing ends April 25<sup>th</sup>.
- Sailors participating in Junior Guards will have the option to take a BCYC boat shuttle from the public dock on the peninsula to the yacht club free of charge. Waiver required.
- All sailors and families are encouraged to attend the **Summer Awards Banquet on Saturday August 4<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm.** The banquet will take place the Saturday following the last day of the program.
- All racing sailors must be members of their respective class association (Sabot/CFJ/Laser)
- Boat storage fees are billed monthly by the Accounting Department. To lease a sabot storage slip, please contact the Junior Sailing Director.

# INTRODUCTORY CLASSES

## **Starfish** \*\*\*Ages 5-7\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** The Starfish class is offered to children 5 to 7 years of age. This is an introductory class which consists of developmentally appropriate activities such as fundamental sailing knowledge, knot tying, safety, and water-related activities. Weekly activities include: sailing a variety of different boats (Sabot, Lido 14, Harbor 20) accompanied by a certified sailing instructor, swim lessons with our certified swimming instructor, arts and crafts, and much more. Credentialed teachers plan a well-rounded



curriculum of art activities, gross and fine motor skills development, dramatic play and educational outings. The class introduces Bahia Corinthian Yacht Club, prominent features of Balboa Bay, safe water sport and boating practices, and serves as an introduction to the BCYC Junior Sailing Program.

**Requirements:** Sailors must have a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their use.

## **Sabot – Novice** \*\*\*Ages 7-11\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** The Novice class is an all-encompassing, fun-filled class for children 7-11 years of age in which participants will learn to skipper their own boat. This class is designed for first time sailors, as well as those not yet ready for the C3 Racing class. Curriculum covers the introduction of the Naples Sabot, boat parts, knots, and on-the-water sailing skills with a heavy focus on the fundamentals of upwind sailing. The goal of this class is to teach kids how to safely operate and learn to love their Sabot.



**Requirements:** Sailors must complete and pass a swim test, complete and pass a capsize test, own a fully rigged Naples Sabot and a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their daily use.

# RACING OR CRUISING?

## Sabot – Beginning Racing (C3) \*\*\*Ages 8-13\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** The Sabot C2 & C3 Program is available to children between 8-13 years of age. Sailors who have satisfactorily completed the Novice class will enter into the C3 class. This will be a skill-building class, teaching kids how to safely maneuver their boat in basic race-course situations. Sailors will compete in weekly regattas within the harbor, with opportunities to enter additional regattas on weekends. Sailors progress to the next level (C2) by winning their class events. Sailors typically spend 1-2 years at each level before moving up. If coming from the Novice class, sailors must satisfy the Novice Graduate criteria to be eligible to enroll in the C3 class.



**Requirements:** Sailors must complete and pass a swim test, complete and pass a capsized test, own a fully-rigged Naples Sabot and a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their daily use. Parents may be asked to tow a trailer to travel regattas if their child participates.

**Regatta and travel expenses are not included in class tuition.**

## Junior Mariners \*\*\*Ages 10-17\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** The Junior Mariners class is BCYC's newest program open to children from 10-17 years of age with some previous sailing experience recommended but not required. This course is geared towards junior sailors who are interested in the lifestyle of a mariner beyond racing. Course curriculum will include destination sailing, navigation and orienteering, kayaking, stand-up paddle boarding, model boat building, knot-tying, splicing, powerboat handling, STEM education and more.



**Requirements:** Class participants must complete and pass a swim test and own a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their daily use.

# SINGLE-HANDED RACING

## Sabot – Advanced Racing (C2 / C1 / B / A) \*\*\*Ages 9-17\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** The Advanced Racing Class is available to children from 9-17 years of age who have moved up beyond the C2 class by winning an eligible regatta. This program is dedicated to experienced racing sailors working towards a strong performance at Sabot Nationals. Advanced boat handling, race tactics, course strategy and the Racing Rules of Sailing will be covered extensively. The goal of this class is to produce winning results at the highest levels of youth sabot sailing. **Sailors in this program are strongly encouraged to participate in Junior Sabot Nationals. Regatta and travel expenses are not included in class tuition.**



**Requirements:** Sailors must complete and pass a swim test, complete and pass a capsizing test, own a race-rigged Naples Sabot and a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their daily use. Parents may be asked to tow a trailer to travel regattas if their child participates.

## Laser Intermediate Racing \*\*\*Ages 12-17\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** Laser Racing is an option for teens from 12-17 years of age. Practices will be in conjunction with the CFJ class but offer an alternative to double-handed sailing for those who would like to focus on single-handed competition. This class introduces the Laser to sailors new to the boat by covering proper rigging and de-rigging, boat parts, and boat handling. In addition, the program will foster sailors with prior experience with heavy focus on race tactics, course strategy, and the Racing Rules of Sailing. This is a competitive travel team, and participants are expected to enter in suggested regattas throughout the summer. The goals of this class are to improve on-the-water racing skills and produce winning results.



Sailors in this program are encouraged to participate in both the Junior Olympic Festival in addition to local regattas throughout the summer. Regatta and travel expenses are not included in class tuition.

**Requirements:** Sailing experience is recommended but not required. If your teen is new to sailing and would like to get involved, please contact the Junior Sailing Director for an information meeting. Sailors must complete and pass a swim test, complete and pass a capsizing test, and own a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their daily use as well as proper footwear (no sandals or bare feet). Boat Charter Fee is included in tuition. Parents may be required to tow a trailer to travel regattas if their child participates.

# DOUBLE-HANDED RACING

## CFJ Intermediate Racing \*\*\*Ages 12-17\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** The CFJ Intermediate Racing Program is available to teens from 12-17 years of age. The class introduces the Club Flying Junior dinghy to sailors new to the boat by covering proper rigging and de-rigging, boat parts, and boat handling. In addition, the program will introduce race tactics, course strategy, and the Racing Rules of Sailing. Racing is a large component to this class so participants are expected to enter in regattas throughout the summer. The goals of this class are to teach and improve on-the-water boat-handling skills and racecourse tactics.



**Sailors in this program are encouraged to participate in both the Junior Olympic Festival and CFJ Nationals. Regatta and travel expenses are not included in class tuition.**

**Requirements:** Sailing experience is recommended but not required. If your teen is new to sailing and would like to get involved, please contact the Junior Sailing Director for an information meeting. Sailors must complete and pass a swim test, complete and pass a capsizing test, and own a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their daily use as well as proper footwear (no sandals or bare feet). Boat Charter Fee is included in tuition. Parents may be asked to tow a trailer to travel regattas if their child participates.

## C420 Advanced Racing \*\*\*Ages 12-17\*\*\*

**Eligibility:** The C420 Advanced Racing Program is available to teens from 12-17 years of age with previous double-handed racing experience required. The class introduces the Club 420 dinghy to sailors new to the boat by covering proper tuning and boat setup. This program will focus heavily on race tactics, course strategy, and the Racing Rules of Sailing. This is a competitive travel team, and participants are expected to enter in regattas throughout the summer. The goals of this class are to improve on-the-water racing skills and produce winning results.



**Sailors in this program are expected to participate in the Junior Olympic Festival. Regatta and travel expenses are not included in class tuition.**

**Requirements:** Double-handed sailing experience is required. If your teen is new to sailing and would like to get involved, consider enrolling in the CFJ Intermediate Racing class or contact the Junior Sailing Director for an information meeting. Sailors must complete and pass a swim test, complete and pass a capsizing test, and own a United States Coast Guard (U.S.C.G.) approved life jacket fit for their daily use as well as proper footwear (no sandals or bare feet). Boat Charter Fee is included in tuition. Parents may be asked to tow a trailer to travel regattas if their child participates.
